We are grateful to be in the Yellow Phase on campus for Father's Day but please remember that guidelines are still in place for visits:

- Visitors must be screened and get a name badge, wear a face covering and remain physically distanced.
- Visits are to take place outside of buildings. You may utilize spaces on campus, like the gazebo in Leaman Woods, but these places cannot be reserved.
- Gatherings are not allowed. Each visit is limited to two adults and children from the same household.
- If you are eating together, please have individually packaged meals so you are not sharing serving utensils and can remain physically distanced.

As a reminder, window visits to Healthcare and Personal Care residents are scheduled visits, not drop by.

Blue Phase


On Monday, June 22, 2020, we will begin the transition to the Blue Phase. As mentioned earlier this week, not everything listed on the Reopening Plan in the Blue Phase will happen immediately and the move forward will be assessed regularly based on the number of positive cases on campus. The things that will change next week include:

- Limited Opening of the Pool for Resident Use
- Low Intensity Wellness Classes Conducted in the West Community Room
- High Intensity Wellness Classes Outdoors
- Limited Off Campus Bus Trips Resume
- Resident-led Activities Resume with Guidelines (not yet distributed)
- Residents Visiting Residents Indoors with Guidelines (not yet distributed)

Dining, Shuttle, Volunteers, and Visitation are not changing at this time. Consult the Yellow Phase of the plan for more information.

Resident Cases & Testing

There are many layers of complexity to caring for residents who have tested positive for COVID-19 and our work to contain the spread. Along with the COVID unit in Conestoga, multiple Red Zones have been



established in Personal Care. Every precaution is being taken. Personal protective equipment is critical to the effort to protect both residents and team members. EACH DAY the team is using approximately 1000 disposable gowns, 1000 pair of gloves, and more than 3000 surgical masks. Fortunately, the goggles and face shields are reusable but they must be cleaned regularly. We are constantly ordering PPE to maintain our supply.

Team member availability is also part of the complexity because of their own positive tests, family members who are positive or being tested, or concerns over other possible exposure. We are grateful to the dedicated team who is working together to care for residents and support each other.

Apart from Universal Testing, the pending test in Personal Care has come back positive. Two additional tests are now pending for Personal Care residents who displayed symptoms. To our knowledge, no tests are pending for Residential Living.

The second round of universal testing for Healthcare concludes today. Results will be shared next week. Many team members are also being tested.
