Student Artists Honored

Landis Homes was recently host to a most unusual art reception. It featured the works of one current and five former students of Lancaster Mennonite High School. Each year since 1995, Landis Homes has juried the LMHS Fine Arts Festival in the spring and selected the work of one student to become part of the permanent art collection on the retirement community campus. This year in addition to selecting a new piece, the five former student winners were invited to a reception and to bring their most recent work to show.

The student selected from this year's festival was Joshua Kiehl who made a two-dimensional ceramic

Another artist Fumi Ono was selected in 1998 for her pen and ink drawing, "Hands". She is a second year student at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia and has been concentrating the past year in ceramics and three-dimensional work. "I am young as an artist and still exploring new opportunities," Ono said with a smile.

Color photographs of the West are the subject matter of the work of Jeremy Hess whose photo, "Walking Toward the Light", was chosen for the permanent collection in 1997. He attends Colorado Mountain College with a major in photography.

Hess said, "It was my experiences of taking photography classes at Lancaster Mennonite that led me in the direction I am following today. I try to honor God in all my work."

Kristine Hess who is a very recent graduate of Houghton College as an art major, was the honored student in 1996. Her acrylic piece, "Blue Dancer" graces a lounge at Landis Homes. She brought to the show a number of sketches in pencil and ink as well as a three-dimensional series entitled, "Annunciation". Hess will be attending Penn State in the fall beginning a masters program in Art History.

The artist selected in 1995 was Nigel Green. His water-

color, "Park Benches" which he created at age 16, was the first piece selected from LMHS for the Landis Homes collection. Since that time Nigel attended the Governor's School for Art, attended a year at Tyler School of Art and currently paints in acrylics and watercolors in his studio in New Holland.

In introducing the students at the reception, Chair of the LMHS art department Becky Wiedner said, "What a wonderful way to honor these young artists and encourage them in their talents."

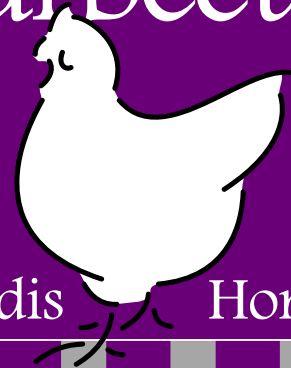
