

## Auxiliary Gives New Shuttle Vehicle

Beginning in January 2001, the campus shuttle has a new vehicle and extended hours to provide transportation to residents. In December a celebration was held for the volunteer drivers who make it possible for the shuttle to run. At that event the Landis Homes Auxiliary President Janet Horst handed over the keys to a 1992 Chevrolet Caprice station wagon to Landis Homes President Ed Longenecker.

In addition to many volunteer endeavors, the Landis Homes Auxiliary uses funds raised at the Annual Fellowship Day in September for projects to benefit the 650 residents who live on campus. For this year the project is the new shuttle vehicle.

The shuttle service, which first began in March 2000, has operated primarily afternoons since its initiation. Residents have learned to depend on it for transportation from one part of the campus to an-

other for events, appointments, and services.

A number of timely events culminated in the purchase of the new vehicle. A resident and staff committee was working throughout the past year on ideas for making the campus more accessible. It didn't take long to realize extended shuttle transportation to the morning hours was necessary. At that time the same vehicle used for shuttle service in the afternoons was also used for the post office run every morning. The

# Residents Assist University

As Ella Weaver, age 89, stuffed materials into an envelope and put it in a stack, Marian Lichty, 91, “painted” an envelope with water and brush and sealed it. Stacks of sealed envelopes were then counted by other volunteers into groups of 50 or 100 and boxed to send to Eastern Mennonite University (EMU), Lancaster Campus, for mailing. The place was Landis Homes activity room and the volunteers were primarily residents who live on the campus. Most of the residents live in the assisted living and healthcare areas.

“It was a great activity,” said Activity Director Tina Mast Burnett. “As people worked some talked about their own EMU experiences or family connections there.” Burnett, whose son is at EMU main campus in Harrisonburg, VA, reported about 30 to 35 persons came to work on the 6000-piece mailing on three different days. Some persons came eagerly to help for a second or even a third time. “There was something everyone could do, and it was a nice atmosphere for visiting together, while working together.”
