# From the Board Chairperson and the President

ver 40 years ago seeds were planted in the fertile soil of Landis Valley. The seeds sprouted and grew. Thanks to many individuals who faithfully watered and tended the planting it has prospered in many ways. We are especially grateful to God for the blessings he has provided us.

We regularly hear from residents, families, and others who bear testimony to the fruit born at Landis Homes. A family member wrote saying, "When our parents moved to Landis Homes we were pleased with their decision, but we had no idea how fulfilling residing there would become to them".

A student intern wrote, "I am constantly amazed at the people working here and the sense of community and teamwork that exists. Landis Homes is a special place."

These are encouraging words as so many invest their efforts in the ongoing life and activity of our community. As we celebrated our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary several changes took place on the campus.

- 1) Opening of Manheim and Oregon Houses for healthcare. We are so grateful for the guieter and more homelike environment.
- 2) Opening of new Rehab and Fitness Center and a new laundry as well as renovations to Ephrata House healthcare.
- 3) Opening of the completely renovated Dogwood Commons, which was transformed into a consolidated office as well as an employee and visitor dining area.

In a year of significant investment in building upgrades we are happy to report financial strength. These are times of decreasing public funding and rising benevolent care. Many persons responded with generous support to the "Building to Serve" campaign, as well as to the Endowment and Caring Funds.

In addition to these monetary contributions, we are also thankful for the numerous volunteers who daily supplement the efforts of staff. With the many hours of contributions by volunteers it is much more possible to provide quality services to the persons we serve.

Our 40th year was also a year of reexamination. We initiated our re-accreditation by the Continuing Care Accreditation Commission. We hope to achieve this

criterion for good business practice and delivery of quality service by the spring of 2005.



Director of Development John Buckwalter said, "All the persons who participated in the last three annual chicken barbecue events associated with Fellowship Day made this generous gift possible."




