- 2) Opening of new Rehab and Fitness Center and a new laundry as well as renovations to Ephrata House healthcare.
- 3) Opening of the completely renovated Dogwood Commons, which was transformed into a consolidated office as well as an employee and visitor dining area.

In a year of significant investment in building upgrades we are happy to report financial strength. These are times of decreasing public funding and rising benevolent care. Many persons responded with generous support to the "Building to Serve" campaign, as well as to the Endowment and Caring Funds.

In addition to these monetary contributions, we are also thankful for the numerous volunteers who daily supplement the efforts of staff. With the many hours of contributions by volunteers it is much more possible to provide quality services to the persons we serve.


Our 40th year was also a year of reexamination. We initiated our re-accreditation by the Continuing Care Accreditation Commission. We hope to achieve this

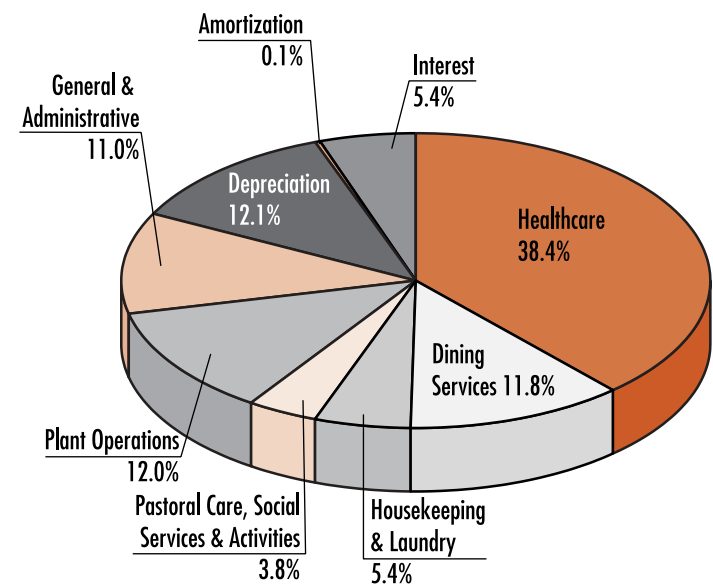
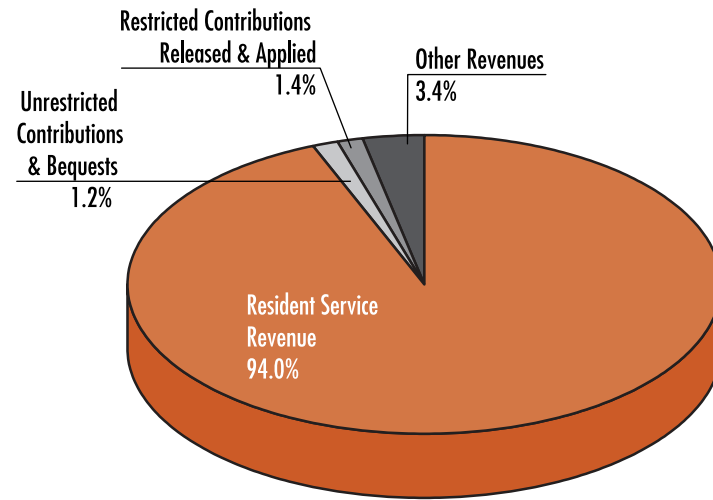
